Title: ‘Join us, join us:’ McClatchy, Sac High students walk out of school to march against Trump

Summary: About 500 people protesting the inauguration of Donald Trump as president converged Friday on the state Capitol after marching along various routes through Sacramento.

The march was peaceful, with police controlling traffic and closing downtown intersections to accommodate the marchers.

One group, numbering about 100 people, started marching at **Sacramento City College**. About 1 p.m., they passed C.K. McClatchy High School with chants of, “Join us, join us.”

Cosumnes River College student Lola Chase was among the marchers walking from Sacramento City College to the Capitol.

“I refuse to let hatred become the norm,” said Chase, 18. “Islamophobia, xenophobia, racism and sexism were not OK before and they’re not OK now.”

Title: UWF invites public to explore integration of art and science through STEAM2017

Summary: Beginning in February 2017, the University of West Florida will explore the integration of science, technology, engineering, art and mathematics to determine how those fields can influence the preservation of a clean environment through a new public program, STEAM2017.

STEAM2017 is a five-week program which will include art exhibitions, lectures, artist-led workshops for students of regional K-12 programs, and a one-day colloquium with participants and speakers from around the nation.

Public panels will be led by Jiayi Young, professor of design at UC Davis; Shih-Wen Young, professor of astronomy and physics at **American River College**; Elizabeth Demaray, award-winning artist; Jeff Schmuki and Wendy Deschenes from Plantbot Genetics; Thomas Asmuth, assistant professor at the UWF Department of Art; and Sara Gevurtz, adjunct professor of art at VCU.
