Free college for West Sacramentans

Are you a recent West Sacramento high school graduate? West Sacramento Center Residents of the City of West Sacramento who graduated from a high school from the Washington Unified School District will be able to attend their first year at any Sacramento City College location (Main campus, West Sacramento Center, or Davis Center) fee-free (up to 12 units per semester). Applications for the fall 2018 semester are now being accepted.

The West Sacramento College Promise is an initiative approved by the voters of the City of West Sacramento in November 2016 as part of the City's Kids' Home Run Program. The West Sacramento College Promise allocates funds to cover at least the first year's community college fees for eligible West Sacramento students. The program is a partnership between the City of West Sacramento, Washington Unified School District, and Sacramento City College.

5 steps to apply for 2018-19 West Sacramento Promise Program

Step 1: Meet the criteria

1. Are you a current resident of West Sacramento? (Please note: SCC reserves the right to request official documentation of your legal residence.)

2. Did you/will you graduate from high school or receive a GED from Dec. 1, 2017 to May 31, 2018? (Note: High school location must be in West Sacramento.)

3. Do you plan to enroll in Sacramento City College

for the fall 2018 semester full-time (at least 12 units)?

If you answered YES to ALL of the above, please move on to Step 2.

Step 2

Apply to Sacramento City College

Complete and submit your application starting May 1. Once your application has been accepted, you will receive a Los Rios Student ID number by email which you will need to complete the Promise application. More information on becoming a student.

Step 3

Apply for West Sacramento Promise

Complete the Promise Application at www.scc.losrios.edu/promise/west-sacramento-promise-application/

Step 4

Apply for financial aid

Fill out your Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) online at FAFSA.gov. (This fall's deadline passed on March 2). You may qualify for the BOG Fee Waiver and additional grants, work-study jobs, scholarships, or loans by completing your FAFSA. More information on Financial Aid. Step 5

Pre-enrollment and registration

Complete Sacramento City College's "Steps to Success" and enroll in 12 or more units for the fall 2018 semester (priority registration dates and times will vary; check eServices in mid-November for your scheduled date/time).
